### **1. Bandit and Version 1.02 Release**

An updated version (1.02) of Bandit is available on our web site for download at <http://www.pwrc.usgs.gov/BBL/resources/bandit/Software/index.html>.

In Bandit Version 1.0, there were several problems with handling Bandit data in the BBL that were transparent to the user. One of the main issues involved importing Band Manager data when 'Numeric' wasn't selected in the settings, Age and Sex were blank in the data file sent to the BBL when 'Submit Data' was pressed. Those of you who are in this situation will be contacted shortly after this release to resubmit your data. This now works properly in Bandit 1.02. Bandit 1.02 alleviates the need to export and import data again for your inventory, locations, and banders as that happens automatically during the install process.

The "Bandit Bander Reference Guide" has been extensively rewritten with better descriptions of how to use all of the functions, particularly; importing files from Band Manager, how to ensure your locations are valid, and describing various error messages. There is also a description of how to use the back-up files created by Bandit and a handy new feature where you only have to click and select the back-up file you wish to load. This will be very handy as you learn to navigate through the program. If you make an error that cannot be corrected within the program, you can now easily reload a back-up file to correct it.

The "Bandit Bander Reference Guide" can be found from the Bandit program by clicking on Bandit Help > Bandit Web Site > Bandit Documentation.

We would like to stress the use of the Bandit Help Desk [bandithelp@usgs.gov](mailto:bandithelp@usgs.gov) for any questions, comments or problems you encounter while using the program. A link is also at the bottom of the start page of Bandit. E-mails sent to the Bandit Help Desk will be answered within 48 hours and are generally answered within hours on the day they are received. As with any new software, we are aware there will probably be a few problems that we have not uncovered during our extensive testing at the BBL prior to release. However, we do find that most of the requests

for help that we receive are usually answered quite quickly and easily, and most of the problems result from the user being unaware of the full functionality of the program.

Lastly, please be sure that all data files sent to [bandit@usgs.gov](mailto:bandit@usgs.gov) have a .tab extension.

## **2. Bandit Training Workshops**
